The Susan Hollenbach Memorial Scholarship has been established in memory of Susan Bruner Hollenbach, who taught in the North Penn School District from 1991 to 2007. The recipient of the award will be a graduating North Penn High School Senior, who has chosen to pursue a college degree in elementary or secondary education.

Susan was born in Upper Darby, Pennsylvania and was raised and educated in Delaware County, graduating from Springfield High School. She earned a bachelor's degree in education from Millersville University and a master's degree in education from West Chester University.

Susan began her career in the Marple-Newtown School District, teaching 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grades. After relocating to central Pennsylvania, Sue taught in the Elizabethtown School District where she was named Teacher of the Year in 1990, and was nominated for The Pennsylvania Department of Education Teacher of the Year in 1991. For the last 16 years of her life, Susan taught first and second grades at Gwynedd Square Elementary in the North Penn School District. A beloved educator for 35 years, Susan was known for her dedication to her students.

I believe the easiest way to understand Susan and her commitment to education is through the words of those who knew her best: A Superintendent in the Elizabethtown School District, a Principal in the North Penn School District, the parent of one of Susan's students, and finally in the words of the Senior who will be the first recipient of the scholarship established in Susan's name.
